Do not click on any unsolicited hyperlinks in SMS

Friends of Crime Prevention Team for Residential Buildings (Women) and members of the public received a SMS embedded with a suspicious link (<https://gov.dsf.tax>). The SMS tricked people into believing that it was sent by the Financial Services Bureau, which instructs citizens to key in personal and credit card details. The Financial Services Bureau made it clear that it has never sent out such text message and has already filed a complaint with the police regarding the fake SMS.

The Judiciary Police urges the public to refrain from clicking on any suspicious links in SMS or keying in any personal details.

Preventive measures:

1. Stay abreast of cyber-security information to keep yourself vigilant;
2. Avoid clicking on suspicious links within the body of a SMS to keep phone or computer virus attacks at bay;
3. Check if the link sent to you match the official one of the company;
4. Do not key in your personal information in any suspicious websites to prevent identity theft;
