Exercise caution when travelling during the Chinese New Year Beware of online shopping scams pertaining to fake travel agency website

As the year draws to a close and the Chinese New Year approaches, many residents are planning trips for the holiday season. The Judiciary Police (PJ) has recently discovered that scammers are creating fake travel agency pages on social media platforms, posting fraudulent advertisements for travel products, and claiming to offer “buy-one-get-one-free” air-ticket promotions or “limited-time discounts” to lure residents into purchasing non-existent travel packages. Once the victim pays a deposit or the full amount, the scammer immediately blocks the victim and disappears, leaving the victim to realize they have been deceived.



The Anti-Fraud Coordination Centre of the Judiciary Police reminds the public:

1. Do not trust advertisements on social media that offer prices far below market value, and avoid conducting transactions with online accounts of unknown origin.
2. When purchasing travel products, choose reputable agencies and make transactions only through official and verified channels.
3. If in doubt, use the Judiciary Police “Anti-Scam App” to check the risk score, or call the anti-fraud enquiry hotline at 8800 7777 or the crime report hotline at 993 for assistance.
