Beware of new Facebook online shopping scam Do not trust any QR code claiming to process a refund

The Judiciary Police (PJ) has recently detected that fraudsters are creating Facebook pages impersonating local travel agencies or specialty food shops. They then publish scam advertisements offering buffet vouchers, steak products and other goods at discounted prices, luring residents into making payments via MPay.

New modus operandi

The fraudsters later claim that the “buffet is fully booked” or that “stock is insufficient,” and falsely state that a refund must be arranged. They instruct victims to scan an unknown QR code and enter their password to complete a so-called “refund registration.” In reality, by following these instructions, the victim is authorizing their MPay account to be bound to a third-party shopping platform, enabling the fraudsters to use that account for purchases. As a result, victims not only lose the original “payment for goods,” but also suffer additional financial losses.

Between 22 and 24 June 2026, the Judiciary Police received reports from 10 residents, with losses ranging from MOP 410 to MOP 17,383, amounting to a total loss of approximately MOP 52,000.

The Anti-Fraud Coordination Centre of the Judiciary Police reminds the public:

1. Exercise caution when shopping online. For products advertised at unusually low prices, verify their authenticity with the physical merchant before making any transaction.
2. Never scan QR codes from unknown sources to avoid unauthorized access to your electronic payment accounts.
3. Adjust the spending limit of your electronic payment accounts according to your online shopping habits to reduce potential risks.
4. If in doubt, use the Judiciary Police "Anti-Fraud App" to check the risk index, or call the PJ anti-fraud enquiry hotline at 8800 7777 or the crime report hotline at 993 for assistance.
